FLY-FISHING WORKSHOP

The Department of Industry, Tourism and Investment will be hosting a fly-fishing workshop for the tourism operators in the Northwest Territories September 14 &15, 2010 in Yellowknife.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the workshop are to teach the tourism operators how to fly-fish, the equipment needed, how to teach their guests to fly-fish and prepare for fly-fishing excursions in the Northwest Territories. The focus of the fly-fishing workshop will be on Arctic grayling, lake trout and northern pike.

INSTRUCTOR

The instructor, Mr. Duane Radford, is an award-winning writer and photographer residing in Edmonton. He is an experienced fly-fisherman and has fly-fished extensively in the Northwest Territories, Nunavut and Yukon and has developed a skill set and gained invaluable knowledge over the past decade fly-fishing for Arctic grayling, lake trout and northern pike.

He worked for the Fish and Wildlife Division in Alberta for 34 years until his retirement in 2002. He is the Vice President of the Outdoor Writers of Canada, a member of the Edmonton Trout Fishing Club, the Alberta Fish and Game Association, and is a Field Editor of The Canadian Fly Fisher magazine.
