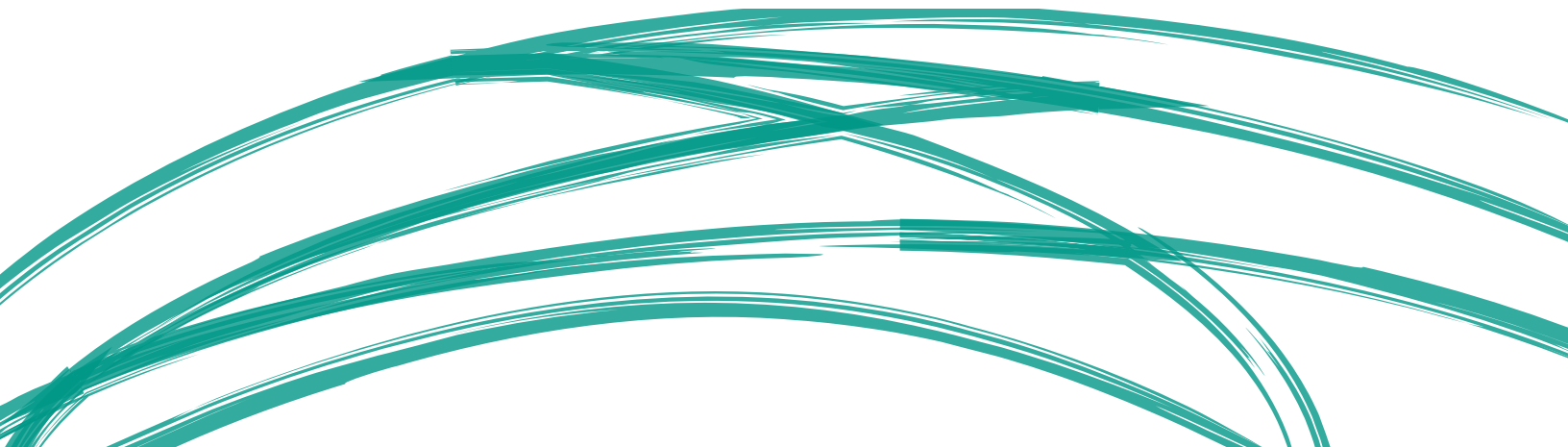


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MINISTER'S MESSAGE

PREFACE

The Department of Industry, Tourism and Investment (ITI) has a mandate to promote economic self-sufficiency by funding support, and marketing initiatives designed to foster a positive economic environment in our territory.

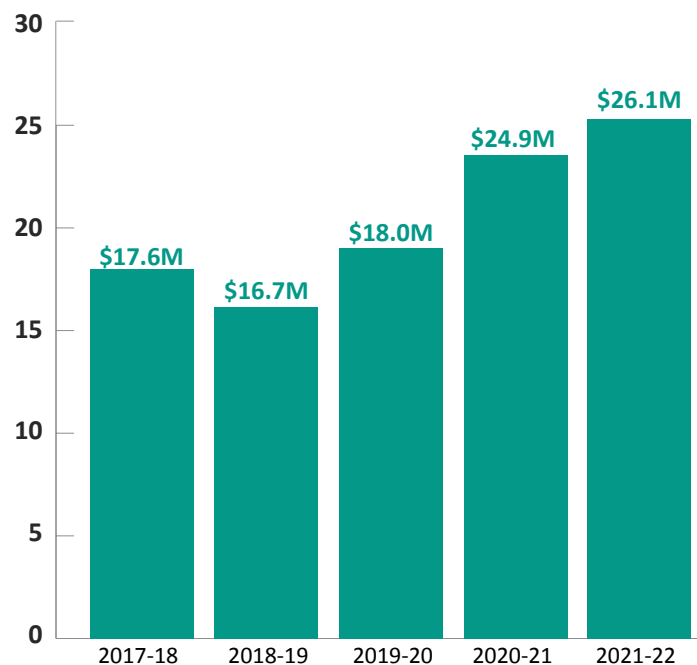
This is done through a number of measures, including the delivery and management of financial grants and contribution programs to a wide range of clients and agencies in a variety of sectors.

This report provides a summary of grants and contributions provided throughout the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

In the 2021-2022 fiscal year, ITI provided \$26.1 million in financial support to 721 individuals, entrepreneurs, businesses, governments, and groups across the NWT.

Contributions paid in the 2021-2022 fiscal year included \$8.2 million in GNWT and federal contributions identified for COVID-19 supports.

MAJOR GRANTS AND CONTRIBUTIONS

ITI provided \$6.3 million in funding for two major NWT wide organizations which, collectively, had a significant impact on the NWT economy and the well-being of individual entrepreneurs and businesses. (Table 1)

COMMUNITY, REGION AND TERRITORIAL RESULTS

Grants and contributions are categorized into three overarching community groupings: Yellowknife, Hay River, Inuvik and Fort Smith are categorized as **Level 1** communities. The NWT's 29 remaining communities are identified as **Level 2** communities. Projects that serve more than one community are identified as **Pan-territorial**.

In 2021-2022 28 per cent of grants and contributions went to 29 designated Level 2 communities.

Table 3 shows the allocation of grants and contributions by community and region; and notes the total of contributions made to clients serving, all or, a number of communities.

Chart 2 shows the distribution of funding by region.

Chart 3 presents allocations made to Level 1 and Level 2 communities and territory-wide contributions.

Chart 2: Grants and Contributions by Region 2021-2022 (\$26,091,435)

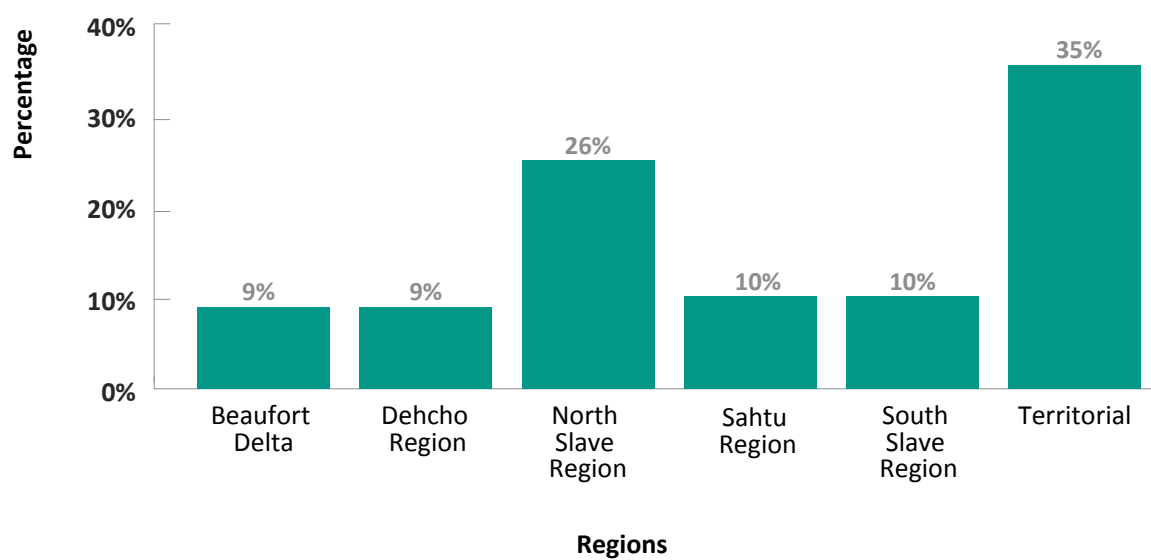
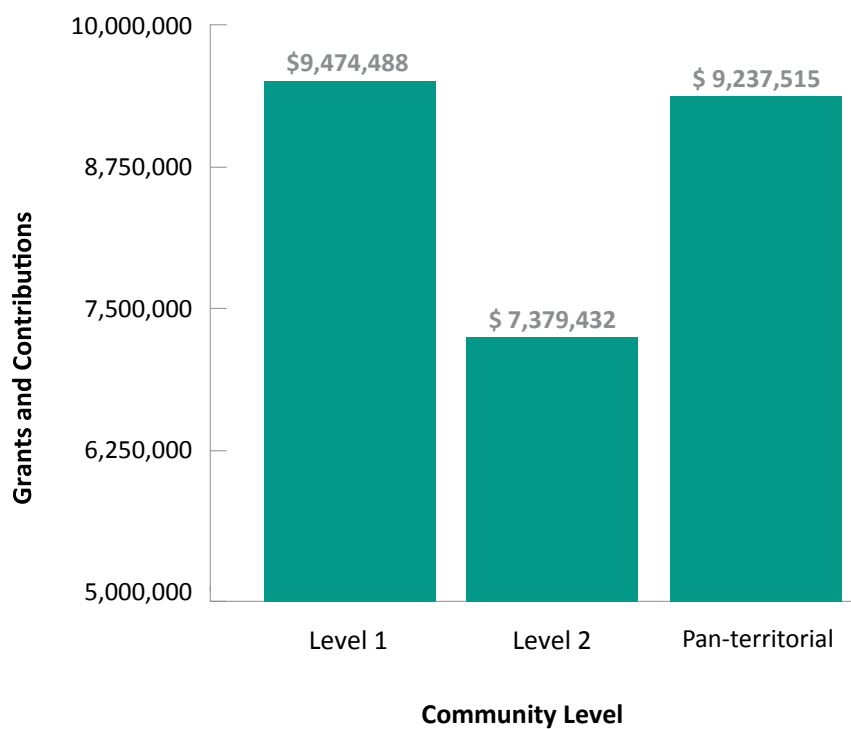


Chart 3: Grants and Contributions by Community Level



SECTOR DISTRIBUTION

The Department's grants and contribution programs are structured to support three broad investment themes or pillars.

Under the *Unlocking Our Potential* theme are contributions that provide support to the mineral and petroleum economic sectors and the NWT Geological Survey.

The *Investing in Diversity* theme encompasses programming around tourism, arts, film, commercial fishing, agriculture, and the traditional economy.

Under *Business Services* are those contributions designed to support the development of small and medium sized business and manufacturing in the NWT.

As shown in Table 4, contributions described under Business Services accounted for 37 per cent of the Department's overall grants and contributions.

These contributions are under the Support for Entrepreneurs and Economic Development (SEED) program and through business-support agencies including Community Futures Organizations and the Business Development and Investment Corporation.

Contributions to tourism-related businesses and initiatives accounted for 42 per cent of total grants and contributions.

ITI administered 28 separate funding programs in the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

Chart 4 - Grants and Contribution by Investment and Economic Sector

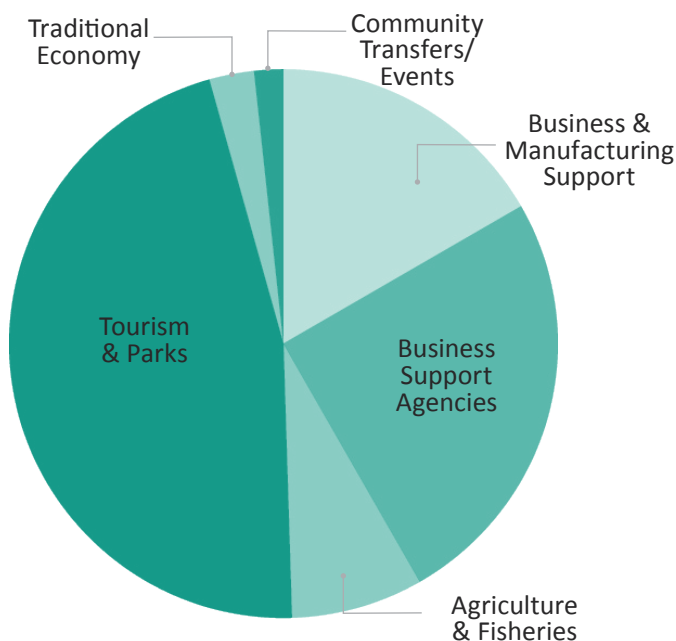

PRÉFACE

Le mandat du ministère de l'Industrie, du Tourisme et de l'Investissement (MITI) est de faire la promotion de l'autonomie économique des Territoires du Nord-Ouest (TNO) par l'intermédiaire de financement, de soutien et d'initiatives de marketing qui favorisent un environnement économique positif pour notre territoire.

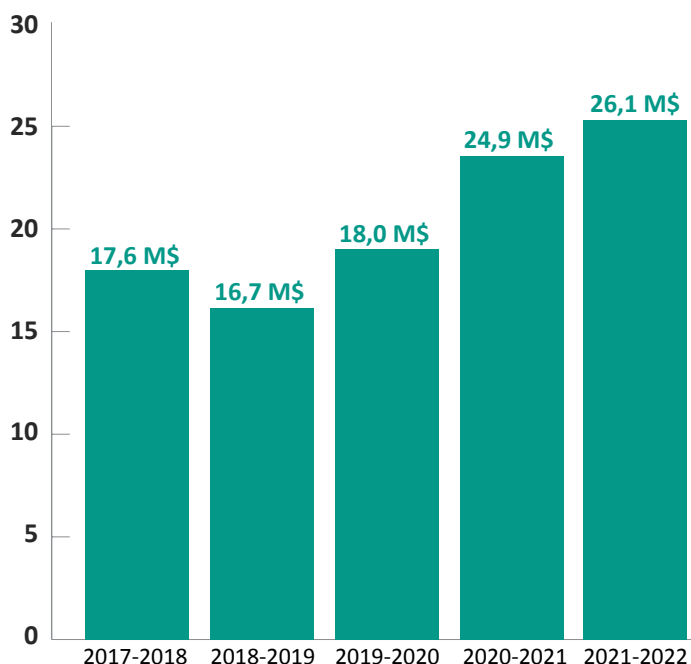
Pour ce faire, on met en œuvre une série de mesures, notamment l'exécution et la gestion de programmes de subventions et de contributions financières destinés à une variété de clients et d'organismes dans de nombreux secteurs.

Le présent rapport résume les subventions et les contributions versées au cours de l'exercice 2021-2022.

Durant l'exercice 2021-2022, le MITI a versé 26,1 millions de dollars en aide financière à plus de 721 particuliers, entrepreneurs, entreprises, gouvernements et groupes à l'échelle des TNO.

Parmi ces contributions, le GTNO et le gouvernement fédéral ont versé 8,2 millions de dollars pour mettre en place des mesures de soutien liées à la COVID-19.

RÉSULTATS À L'ÉCHELLE LOCALE, RÉGIONALE ET TERRITORIALE

La distribution des subventions et des contributions est organisée en trois grands groupes communautaires: les collectivités de **niveau 1**, soit Yellowknife, Hay River, Inuvik et Fort Smith; les collectivités de **niveau 2**, soit les 29 autres collectivités ténoises; et les projets **panterritoriaux**, soit les projets qui visent plus d'une collectivité.

En 2021-2022, 28 pour cent des subventions et des contributions ont été accordées à 29 collectivités désignées de niveau 2.

Le tableau 3 montre l'attribution des subventions et des contributions par collectivité et par région, et fait état du total des contributions versées aux clients qui ont effectué des projets visant toutes les collectivités ou plusieurs d'entre elles.

Le graphique 2 montre la distribution du financement par région.

Le graphique 3 montre l'attribution des subventions et des contributions aux collectivités de niveau 1 et de niveau 2, ainsi que les subventions et contributions accordées à l'échelle territoriale.

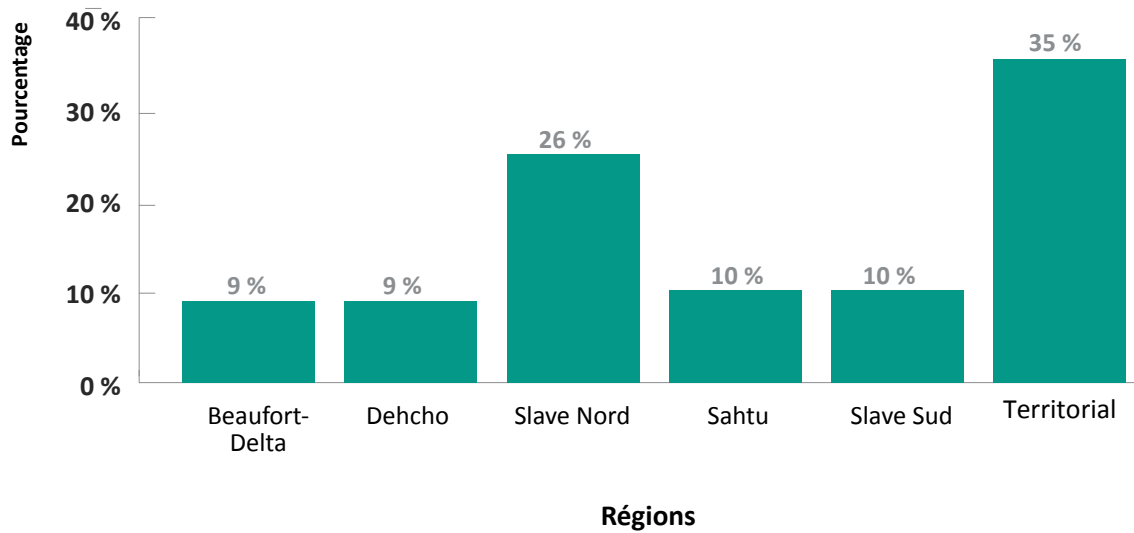

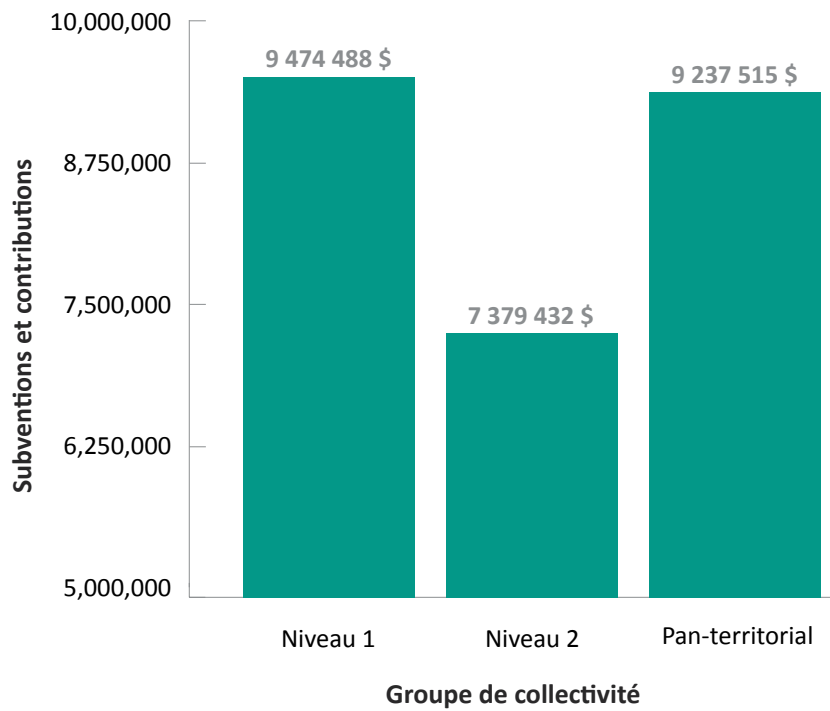

DISTRIBUTION PAR SECTEUR

Les programmes de subventions et de contributions du Ministère ont été conçus de façon à cibler trois grands secteurs d'investissement.

Le volet *Explorons notre potentiel* comprend des contributions qui soutiennent les secteurs économiques des minéraux et du pétrole ainsi que la Commission géologique des TNO.

Le volet *Investir dans la diversité* comprend des programmes axés sur le tourisme, les arts, le cinéma, la pêche commerciale, l'agriculture et l'économie traditionnelle.

Dans les *Services aux entreprises*, on retrouve les contributions destinées à soutenir le développement des petites et moyennes entreprises et de la fabrication aux TNO.

Comme indiqué dans le tableau 4, les contributions décrites dans services aux entreprises comptent pour 37 % de l'ensemble des subventions et contributions du Ministère.

Ces programmes sont menés dans le cadre du Programme d'appui aux entrepreneurs et au développement économique (PAEDE) et par des organismes de soutien aux entreprises, comme les organisations d'aide au développement des collectivités du Nord et la Société d'investissement et de développement.

Les contributions aux entreprises et initiatives liées au tourisme ont représenté 42 % du total des subventions et contributions.

Le MITI a administré 28 programmes de financement distincts au cours de l'exercice 2021-2022.

Graphique 4 : Subventions et contributions par secteur économique en 2021-2022

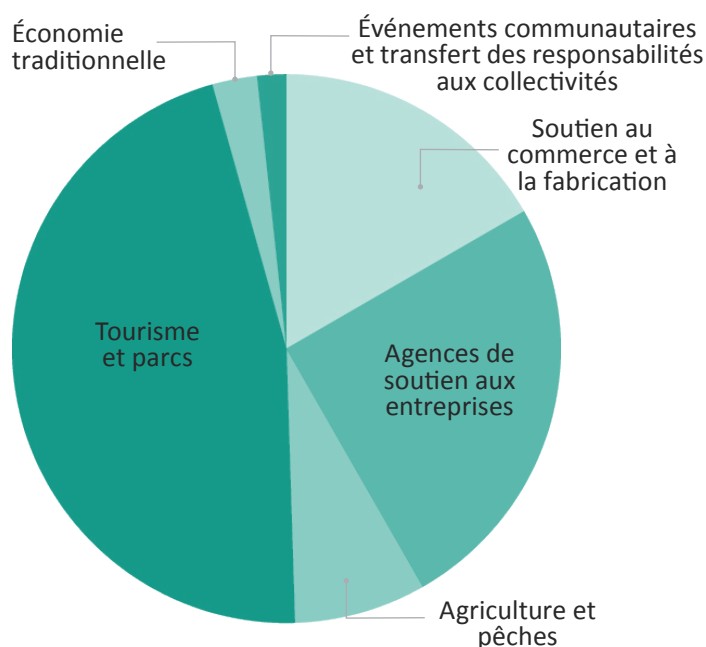

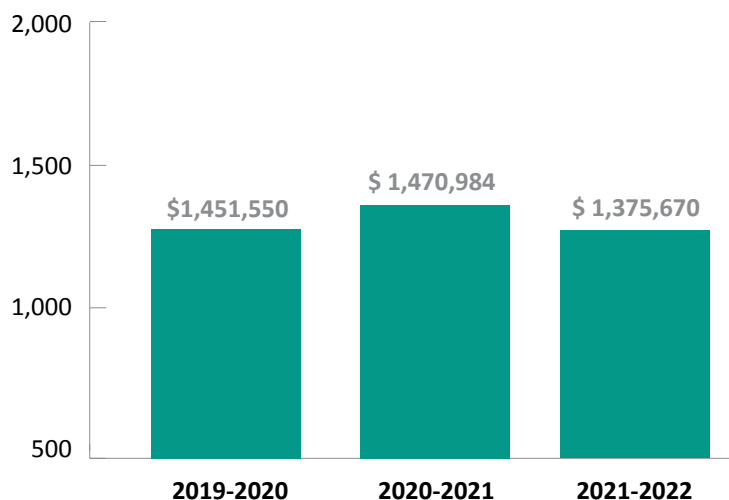

COMMUNITY TRANSFER INITIATIVES

Purpose

Under the Community Transfer Initiative (CTI), salary and operations funding is provided to Northwest Territories communities to employ Economic Development Officers responsible for servicing that community.

All NWT communities are eligible to request the transfer of an ITI EDO position, where one has not already been transferred.

Results Reporting

CTI Economic Development Officers deliver ITI programming in the community they serve as well as assisting with and directing economic development initiatives. Results of the Community Transfer Initiative are reported by ITI Regional Offices. Reporting includes an annual operational plan, a quarterly activity report and a performance appraisal for the EDO.

For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, **13 NWT** communities participated in the Community Transfer Initiatives Program. \$1.4 million in funding was contributed (including accruals at year end).

Chart 5 provides a summary of transfer amounts for the past three fiscal years.

SUPPORT FOR ENTREPRENEURS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Purpose

The Support for Entrepreneurs and Economic Development (SEED) Policy allows for contributions that will support business starts; develop business capacity and skill levels; and help communities stimulate their local economies.

Eligibility

All NWT businesses, residents, business associations and band or community councils may be eligible. Specific eligibilities are provided under each program category.

Grant/Contribution

Maximum Amount Available Per Applicant

With the exception of the Strategic Investments Program, which allows for contributions up to \$75,000, the maximum amount available is \$25,000, depending on the program category. Clients may access more than one program category in a fiscal year but there is a cap of \$30,000 to any one client in a single fiscal year.

Program Budget

For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, available funding under the SEED policy was \$3,866,000. This funding is inclusive of \$160,000 set aside for projects in the film sector; \$125,000 set aside for projects in the arts and crafts sector; and \$50,000 set aside for the Prospector Grubstake Program.

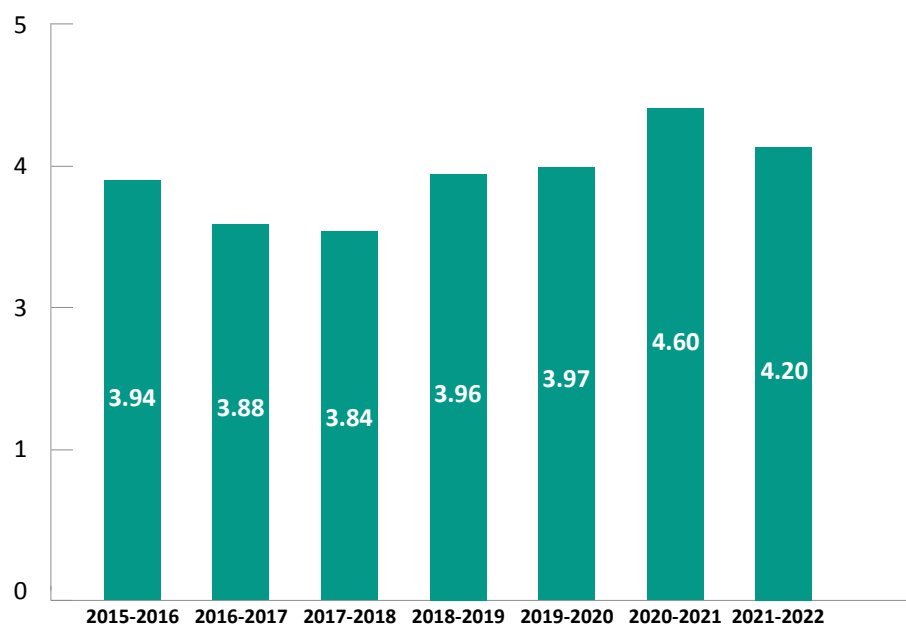
Results Reporting

In the 2021-2022 fiscal year, ITI provided \$4.2 million in contributions to 462 individuals, businesses and organizations in the NWT; down from \$4.6 million in 2020-2021 but up from \$4 million in 2019-2020.

The delivery of SEED contributions in excess of the budgeted amount for 2021-2022 is reflective of additional support programs introduced to address the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

CANADIAN AGRICULTURAL PARTNERSHIP – VARIOUS INITIATIVES

Background to Multilateral Agreement

The five-year multilateral Canadian Agricultural Partnership (the Partnership) came into effect on April 1, 2018. Its goals are to build sector capacity, diversify local economies and encourage market access to fresh food in the NWT. The Partnership is cost shared on a 40:60 basis. The annual federal government contribution equates to \$732,600, while the GNWT provides up to \$488,400.

Purpose of Contributions of Various Initiatives

Investments are intended to build resource capacity, promote greater agriculture awareness, encourage local and commercialized food production and facilitate access and marketability of domestically sourced eggs, and produce from communities throughout the NWT.

FILM

FILM REBATE PROGRAM

Purpose

As an incentive to encourage film and television production companies to film on location in the NWT, rebates are provided to eligible film projects that incur pre-production and production costs including the purchase of NWT goods and services, training and employing NWT residents and travel within the NWT.

Eligibility

Guest Producers, NWT Co-Production Partners and NWT production companies are required to demonstrate a minimum spend of \$60,000 equaling or exceeding 30 per cent of the projects total in-territory investment. Preference is given to projects with TV broadcast or theatrical distribution commitments.

TOURISM SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND

Purpose

The Skills Development Fund supports training related to the tourism sector through three specific streams: the Tourism Training Fund; and Business and Youth Mentorship programs.

Eligibility

- **Tourism Training Fund** - Training must be short, (less than 12 weeks), formal courses or workshops, and can include distance-education initiatives such as correspondence courses, internet or teleconferencing.
- **Tourism Business Mentorship** – Training or mentoring for businesses or individuals engaged or employed in the tourism industry in the NWT. This fund is administered by the Canadian Executive Services Organization.
- **Youth Mentorship for Tourism** - NWT youth interested in gaining more knowledge of the tourism industry or in being employed in the tourism industry.

Purpose

Support licensed tourism operators impacted and most vulnerable to permanent closure by the economic disruptions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic to remain operational through to March 31, 2022.

Eligibility

All licensed tourism operators including sole-proprietors, partnerships, and incorporated companies who have a valid tourism operator license and licensed tourism services are the primary source of income for the household. Applicants must have been in operation

prior to April 1, 2020; without filing for bankruptcy and operating at a loss as a direct result of travel restrictions.

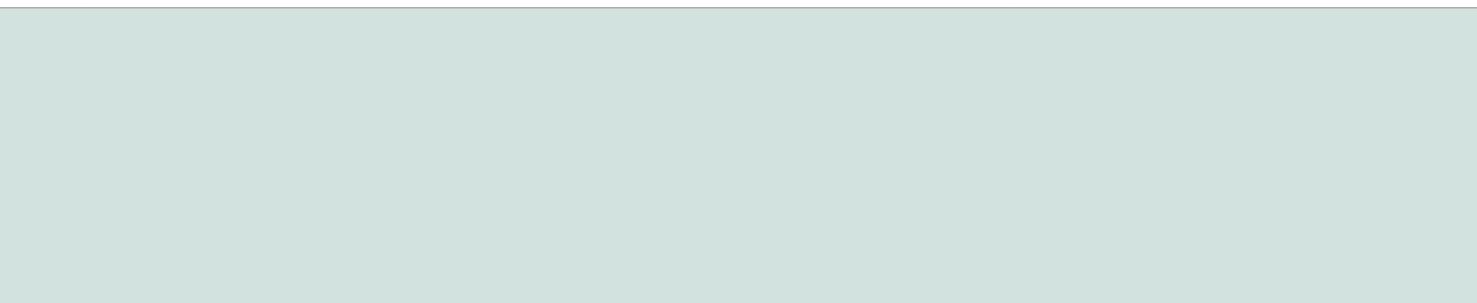
