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AMENITIES

Consult the chart for the services available in each NWT community. Travellers should note that not all communities have banking facilities or ATM machines; cash can usually be obtained at stores in most communities, using either credit or debit card. Most NWT campgrounds can only accept cash payment; fortunately booking online (www.nwtparks.ca) with a credit card is usually an option. Gasoline, diesel and propane are available in the communities listed; there are no service stations between communities, so plan your trip carefully to ensure an adequate fuel supply. Cell phone coverage is limited in the NWT to the area immediately surrounding communities.

THE GREAT TRAIL

The Great Trail, created by Trans Canada Trail and its partners, is a recreational, multi-use trail network that winds its way through every province and territory in Canada, linking over 15,000 communities along its route. Given the geography of Canada, it is not a straight line but one that dips and curves to include as much of the population as possible. The Trail follows a water route in the Northwest Territories and part of Northern Alberta down the Athabasca, Slave and Mackenzie Rivers all the way to the Arctic Ocean. CANADIAN HERITAGE RIVERS

The Canadian Heritage Rivers System is Canada's national river conservation program. It promotes, protects and enhances Canada's river heritage and ensures that Canada's leading rivers are managed in a sustainable manner. The Northwest Territories possesses three of the most remote and pristine Heritage Rivers in Canada. The Arctic Red River offers limitless wilderness experiences to adventurers ready to take on the challenge of this wild land. Its valley, framed by high mountains provides rich habitat for Dall's sheep, caribou, grizzly bear and peregrine falcon. The South Nahanni River is one of the world's great wild rivers and the centerpiece of the Nahanni National Park Reserve, a World Heritage Site. It surges through steep-walled canyons, meanders past steaming hot springs, and drops over the spectacular Virginia Falls, twice the height of Niagara. The Thelon River is the largest Canadian river flowing into the Hudson Bay. In the Northwest Territories the river starts about 110km East of the Great Slave Lake, near White Fish Lake and winds across the barren Lands past extensive flats of white sand and 15m high sand embankments until it reaches the Hudson Bay.
