

2022 Season Highlights

The 2022 parks season demonstrated a substantial recovery following two years of pandemic-related travel restrictions. With restored access granted to all travellers as of April 1st, the season saw a rebound in visitation across all parks in the Northwest Territories; even exceeding pre-pandemic visitation numbers in some facilities.

### **Key Indicators and Notes**

The Department of Industry,
Tourism and Investment is
responsible for compiling and
reporting statistical data related
to campground reservations.
Unless specifically noted, the data
provided in this report is seasonal
(May - September).

Reported data is based on paid camping reservations. The data reported for 2020 is from the June 12 to September 30 time period. The tabulation of overnight visitors and visitor origin includes

seasonal permits. The tabulation of average length of stay excludes seasonal permits. This season's total overnight visitor numbers are based on actual visitor numbers as entered during the reservation and check in process. In years prior to 2021, the total overnight visitor numbers were calculated by multiplying the average party size in each territorial park by the total number of camping permits issued in each territorial park. Party sizes were benchmarked to 2013.

### **NWT Parks Overnight Visitors**

NWT Parks overnight visitation rebounded, with a total of **33,586 overnight visitors** during the 2022 season, a **30% increase** versus the 2021 season.

#### TOTAL NWT PARK OVERNIGHT VISITORS



NWT Parks overnight visitation rebounded to normal, pre-pandemic visitation levels.



### Increase in Overnight Visitors from Outside the NWT

Compared to 2021 pandemic levels, overnight visitors from outside the NWT increased to typical season values.

### **NWT Parks Visitor Origin**



Typically, NWT residents make up about half of all NWT Parks visitors. The 2020 and 2021 pandemic conditions resulted in more NWT residents travelling and vacationing locally, yeilding a spike in park visits compared to pre-COVID-19 years.

During the 2017-2019 seasons the average number of resident visitors to NWT Parks was slightly over 17,000, for the 2020-2021 seasons the average resident visitation was over 23,000 visitors per year - a 36% increase.

As restrictions lifted, beginning in 2022, the upward trend in resident visitation, reversed falling almost 31%. As national and international travel became more viable, NWT Parks experienced a large influx of these travellers, even in comparison to pre-COVID-19 levels at select parks. This more than offset the decrease in local visitors to parks in 2022.

#### Overnight Visitors from Outside the NWT

With travel restrictions and sentiment on travelling relaxed, visitation numbers in NWT Parks returned to pre-pandemic levels.

For the 2022 season, overall almost 50% of overnight visitors to the parks were from outside of the NWT as follows:



The distribution of visitor origin varied between parks. However, most regions reported that greater than 60% of their total visitors were from out of the Territory; as high as 71% in the Beaufort Delta. The North Slave is the exception, as 78% of the region's total visitors reported that they resided within the NWT.

<sup>\*</sup>In the 2020 and/or 2021 seasons the 60<sup>th</sup> Parallel Park, Fort Simpson Park and Happy Valley Parks experienced varying degrees of closures due to the operation of border facilities, spring flooding and border closures (respectively).

The average length of stay in NWT parks was **2.3 days** in 2022, in-line with 2019 figures, but down from 3.3 days in 2021. Likely due to a change in visitor demographic. Residents on 'staycations' booked longer stays in 2021, while non-resident visitors tend to book shorter stays in more parks across the territory.
