Value of Training

How can training help you?

Training can:

- o Improve your skills;
- Increase job satisfaction;
- Boost confidence and productivity;
- Make tourism a successful career choice.

Training helps tourism businesses in the NWT by:

- Motivating staff and increasing productivity;
- Limiting staff turnover;
- Improving customer service;
- Building consistency in product and service delivery;
- Improving public perception of your business by providing professional, world-class tourism experiences.

TOURISM TRAINING FUND

Do you work in tourism or own a tourism business in the Northwest Territories?

Would you like to work in tourism?

The Tourism Training Fund is available to assist individuals and businesses with short-term training (less than 12 weeks).

Up to 75% of your training costs could be funded. (To a maximum of \$3,000 for individuals and \$6,000 for a group.)

If you do not yet have a tourism job, but would like to work in the tourism industry, you can apply for funding to cover up to 50% of training costs.

Training must relate to the tourism industry.

Training must be completed by March 31 of the application year.



Eligible training could be:

- in-person courses or workshops
- on-line courses
- correspondence courses

Eligible costs may include:

- tuition fees
- airfare or ground transportation
- accommodations
- course materials

Funding must have prior approval before starting any training. Costs will be reimbursed upon evidence of successful completion of training.
