



NWT Parks: 2020 Season Highlights

The NWT Parks were significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. The World Health Organization (WHO) officially declared the pandemic on March 11, 2020 and border closures and travel restrictions followed shortly thereafter. The NWT border closed to visitors including non-resident Canadians on March 21, 2020 and remained closed throughout the 2020 NWT Parks season.

Key Indicators and Notes

The Research and Planning Unit within the Tourism and Parks Division compiles and reports key statistics from NWT Parks.

Prior to 2020, the NWT Parks season was generally from May 15 to September 15. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the opening of the NWT Parks was delayed to June 12 and the season extended to September 30. Unless specifically noted, the data provided in this report is seasonal which means that the data reported for 2020 is for the June 12 to September 30

time period and data for 2019 is for the May 15 to September 15 time period.

Data is based on camping permits; permits are issued for each overnight stay. Overnight visitors and visitor origin include seasonal permits as of 2017. Average length of stay excludes seasonal permits. Total overnight visitor numbers are calculated by multiplying the average party size in each territorial park by the total number of camping permits issued in each territorial park. Party sizes are benchmarked to 2013.

NWT Parks Overnight Visitors


The NWT Parks welcomed a total of 23,105 overnight visitors during the 2020 season, a decrease of 34% versus the 2019 season.

From June 12 to September 15 (the time period when the NWT Parks were open to visitors in 2019 and 2020), there were 22,286 overnight visitors, a 28% decline versus same time period prior year. The North Slave region experienced a 9% increase in visitors for this time period.

OVERNIGHT VISITORS TO NWT PARKS





For the 2020 season, the North Slave region which typically welcomes the greatest proportion of NWT residents, experienced only a 3% decline, while the Beaufort Delta region which historically receives visitors mostly from outside of the NWT experienced the strongest decline in visitors (-87%).

NWT Parks Visitor Origin

Of the total 23,105 overnight visitors to the NWT Parks during the 2020 season, 22,753 (98%) were residents of the NWT, a 46% increase versus the 2019 season. There were 352 people from outside of the territory that visited the NWT Parks during the 2020 season.



The 2020 season was significantly different from the 2019 season in terms of the origin of the visitors. For the 2019 season, almost 60% of overnight visitors to the parks were from outside of the NWT as follows:


